PREMINGER, Daniel M., Esq. – 70, of Cape May passed away peacefully on April 8, 2017 after living courageously with Parkinson's for the last 17 years of his life. Born in New York City, NY, Dan has been a resident of Cape May since 1986 after moving here from Center City Philadelphia. Dan graduated from George Washington Law School in 1971 and began his law career as a public defender in Philadelphia where he made a name for himself. Shortly thereafter, he opened his own law office in Philadelphia where he became well-known and achieved notable success within his profession. In 1989 Dan and Barbara purchased a guest house that they ran for 10 years. In 1999 Dan developed and ran with a partner, Safe Harbor Storage. In 2002 Dan and his wife Barbara became owners of the Kings Cottage Bed and Breakfast in Cape May, a business which they have continued to operate to date. Dan is remembered as an intelligent, quick-witted, generous man with great stories and a sense of humor. He loved to travel and spending over 20 years at his beloved home in the Caribbean. In the Cape May community he was on several city boards; the dog park committee and MAC where he took pride in his work for the music festival but Dan was best known for the love of his big white Samoyed dogs, Majestic, Noble and Comet that he walked and greeted locals and tourists all over Cape May. It was his greatest pleasure along with living in Cape May. Dan shared with his wife of 37 years a wonderful exciting life and will always and forever be loved and missed by Barbara. He is also survived by his brother, Michael Preminger and dear friends. A celebration of Dan's life is being planned.
