



## Henry A. Buchianico

April 12, 1923 - May 9, 2013

BUCHIANICO, Henry A. – 90, of Cape May passed away peacefully on Thursday, May 9, 2013. Henry is predeceased by his beloved wife, Dorothy; his mother, Angelina; his father, Domenic; his sisters, Rita and Adelina, and his brothers, Tony, Joseph, and Jackson. Henry is survived by his devoted daughter, Janet and by his brothers-in-law, Angelo Amoroso and Manfredi (Skipper) Amoroso and by his sister-in-law, Judy Amoroso. Henry is also lovingly remembered by his many nieces and nephews.

Henry was born in Philadelphia, PA on April 12, 1923. He was a graduate of South Philly High School. Henry was enlisted in the United States Army during WWII and rose to the rank of Staff Sergeant. He was a combat veteran who led his platoon in the first invasion of Germany where he was wounded. He was honorably discharged from the Army in 1949. He was also a lifetime member of the Cape May VFW, Peterson Little Post 386. After the war Henry worked at the Frankford Arsenal until 1972 when he moved to Cape May. He then worked at Lund's Fishery for 26 years, where he was known as, "Mr. B". The owners of Lund's considered him more of a family member than an employee, and have continued their friendship for over 40 years. His keen business sense and outstanding sense of humor endeared him to all that he knew.

Henry had a passion for bridge and was known as a "master" bridge player. He was also a formidable opponent at chess. Henry spent many enjoyable hours with his bridge club, and was respected by all for his great skill. He will be greatly missed by his bridge partners and friends. He also enjoyed spending time at "The Cove" in Cape May, where he would drive to watch the sunsets.

His greatest love was his wife and daughter, his greatest asset was his sense of humor and his greatest passion was life.
