



Leonard H. Wilmore

August 6, 1942 - January 28, 2020

Leonard Howard Wilmore, known to friends and family as Lenny, had reached the age of 77 when he passed away in the early morning hours of January 28, 2020. Lenny was a patient at the Cape Regional Medical Center in Cape May Court House, NJ, at the time. He had suffered for some years with respiratory problems. Lenny was the first of two sons, born to Leonard and Ruth Wilmore on August 6, 1942, where Lenny's younger brother still lives. Lenny had many friends in Baltimore and in his retirement city of West Cape May and he will be sorely missed. Lenny was educated in Baltimore's public schools, Douglas High School and Edmonson Senior High, where he played the trombone in the school band. After serving in the US Marine Corps in the Vietnam conflict, he returned home and finished his formal education with a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Baltimore. Upon graduation, Lenny worked briefly for IBM's sales division and then began his thirty-plus year career with the United States Postal Service. Lenny worked in the Baltimore area for a few years before being transferred to the Postal Service Administration headquarters in Philadelphia where he worked until his retirement. In his retirement, Lenny relocated to West Cape May, NJ, where he continued to be a productive member of the community. For his first few years in Cape May, he worked as a beach tag checker, where he admitted that he really enjoyed the interaction with the beachgoers. He joined the First Presbyterian Church, which he attended faithfully and where he became assistant treasurer. He was an active member of the West Cape May School Board and the local Kiwanis. He also enjoyed active participation in many of Cape May's annual national and local holiday parades. Lenny never married, but he is survived by his brother, Russell and many cousins on both sides of the family, as well as a multitude of friends. In addition to a service in the Baltimore area, a memorial service in gratitude for Lenny's life will be held on Saturday, March 14, at 11 am, at First Presbyterian Church.
